The Play in Schools Project:

The Play in Schools Project offers advice, support and services to Primary Schools in Nottinghamshire County Council. The aim of the project is to promote develop and support quality play and play related activities.



Courses available through Play in Schools Project:

Midday Play Training: supporting people involved in supervising playtimes to create a fun environment for everyone, provide positive play opportunities for children and empowering adults and children to resolve playtime problems.

Traditional Play: providing opportunities to explore, discover and experience traditional games.

It's Playtime: engaging parents and carers through the school to take part in a variety of play activities, exploring the benefits of play and exploring progression route training and Playwork opportunities.

Therapeutic Play: exploring play as a therapeutic process, adult intervention in children's play and using therapeutic play as a tool to measure children's play.

Potential for other training opportunities may include:

Buddy Training, new ideas for playground games, wet play activities, play ideas using playground markings.

Playworkers in schools:
